NEWLY RENOVATED CARDIAC CATH LAB OPENS

Methodist Dallas' cardiology department and administration team celebrated the opening of the hospital's new and improved cardiac cath lab last March.

The space includes one of the latest Innova systems from GE Healthcare for cardiovascular interventions. The new equipment allows for better image quality and diagnostics that will ultimately improve patient outcomes. The total investment in the new room was close to \$3 million.

"We are thrilled to be able to make these improvements in the catheterization lab," says Arturo Herrera III, AVP of Operations. "But most of all, we're happy to be able to support the cardiology team with the tools they need to continue to provide the excellent patient care they are known for."

Methodist Dallas' new postpartum unit, part of Women and Children's Services, opened its doors in summer 2021. Located on the fourth floor of the Schenkel Tower, the unit will serve as the new home for parents and their babies after delivery.

"Expectant parents can look forward to receiving the same family-centered, high-quality care in a brand new. updated space," says **Theresa Patton, MD**, OB-GYN on the hospital's medical staff. "Methodist Dallas is a Baby-Friendly designated birth facility, which means we'll continue to provide rooming-in with baby and feeding support to parents."

The Rev. Elias Lopez, Director of Pastoral Care at Methodist Health System, led a small blessing ceremony, including a special prayer for all the new babies to grow up to be happy and healthy and leaders in their communities.

STAFF DONATES HUNDREDS OF ITEMS TO THE GOLDEN CROSS PANTRY

Since the opening of its new food pantry in January 2021, the Methodist Dallas Golden Cross Academic Clinic has helped hundreds of people experiencing food insecurity.

Through this program, not only do patients receive assistance in finding local resources and applying for state benefits, they also get more immediate help. Each person is allowed to select 20 items of their choice from the pantry, and if they have a family, they can pick out five additional items for each member of their household.

The pantry is stocked with healthy options, thanks in large part to the generosity of the Golden Cross Board of Directors and staff. In 2021, we distributed a total of 5,874 food items and helped 582 people.
