RAPID HOSPITAL EXPANSION CONTINUES

Methodist Mansfield Medical Center continues to grow alongside the communities it serves and plays a key role in improving the health of the community — starting with its tiniest patients.

This year, the hospital expanded the neonatal intensive care unit, adding new private rooms so parents can stay with their baby 24/7 and give them the opportunity to bond and participate in their baby's care. This expansion allows the hospital to care for more of the region's tiniest patients who are born prematurely or critically ill.

Methodist Mansfield's emergency department also saw a record number of patients in the summer and underwent renovations to enhance access and improve care for residents across Southeast Tarrant County.

To meet the demand for minimally invasive, robotic-assisted surgeries, Methodist Mansfield added a third robotic surgical system to its operating room. The hospital has also welcomed more vascular and orthopedic trauma surgeons to its medical staff as it strives to become a Level II Trauma Center.





In the past year, Methodist Mansfield has launched multiple programs to better care for its patients, including a nonsurgical weight loss and wellness center, a heartburn treatment center, and a satellite campus for the School of Nursing at Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center.

Methodist Mansfield continues to be recognized as the best regional hospital for its clinical excellence, patient satisfaction, and compassionate care.

Renovations at the emergency department at Methodist Mansfield improved patient care and safety last year. Currently in the 96th decile in patient satisfaction, the emergency department at Methodist Mansfield delivers some of the highest ranking patient experience in the nation.

WEIGHT LOSS CENTER OFFERS NONSURGICAL OPTION

Shedding pounds through diet and exercise is achievable at Methodist Mansfield's new Weight Loss and Wellness Center. The unique nonsurgical weight loss program is customized for patients and led by **Nancy Georgekutty, MD**, family and obesity medicine specialist on the hospital's medical staff. Since its opening on May 4, 2022, patients have lost an average of six pounds per month.

"Our goal is to provide innovative and compassionate adult weight management and bariatric care," Dr. Georgekutty says. "Through collaboration, education, and medical therapies, we partner with patients to develop a plan that empowers them to take ownership of their wellness journey."



NEW PROGRAM HELPS COMBAT HEARTBURN AND DIGESTION ISSUES

Methodist Mansfield opened the Heartburn Treatment Center to help provide relief to patients suffering from heartburn and digestive issues. The specially trained digestive care team offers a comprehensive program to diagnose and treat heartburn, acid indigestion, swallowing difficulties, coughing and hoarseness, acid reflux, and chest pain. This offers patients more advanced medical management and minimally invasive options.



MEDICAL TEAM VOLUNTEERS IN HONDURAS

In Honduras, patients in need can wait years for healthcare because of a severe shortage of doctors — so it was a godsend when two registered nurses from Methodist Mansfield Medical Center joined four physicians on the hospital's medical staff for a weeklong mission trip there last

August. Anais Torres, RN; Joshua Trussell, MD; Ivan Cruz Jr., MD; Paige Latham, MD; Elva Bian, DO; and Tabitha Bourgeois, RN, volunteered with charitable organization Medical Missions Outreach (MMO) and traveled 2,000 miles to the Rearick Surgical Center in El Progreso, Honduras. The team worked from morning to evening to perform 27 surgeries in four days, helping local patients who had few other options for medical treatment.

"They were so thankful because it really changed their quality of life," Torres says. "Some of them were in pain and could not work to provide for their families. This helped them get their life back."
