METHODIST RICHARDSON GETS GREEN LIGHT FOR ED EXPANSION

The end of 2021 brought with it the approval of a \$45 million expansion project at Methodist Richardson. The investment will add two new floors totaling about 80,000 square feet and remodel another 25,000 square feet of space to allow for 18 new beds in the emergency department. This will be the third major expansion of the hospital since it opened in 2014.

HELPING THE COMMUNITY BECOME HEART SAFE

Methodist Richardson is proud to have helped the city of Richardson earn its designation as a Heart Safe Community, a nationwide effort designed to reduce the devastating effects of heart disease and improve outcomes of sudden cardiac arrest emergencies.

Thanks to our collaborative efforts, working with local entities like the city's fire and police departments, the North Central Texas Trauma Regional Advisory Council officially presented this award at a recent City Council meeting. The Heart Safe program recognizes communities that have demonstrated excellence in several areas, including access to emergency care, medical dispatch, AED access, advanced life support, and awareness and educational campaigns.



HELPING PROTECT OUR CHILDREN AND FELLOW FRONTLINE WORKERS

As vaccines for COVID-19 rolled out, Methodist Richardson partnered with Richardson ISD to offer immunizations to teachers and other staff members. By turning the auditorium inside the district's administration building into a vaccine clinic, Methodist Richardson nurses were able to administer vaccine shots to more than 1,200 district employees.

THREE CHEERS FOR LEVEL III

Methodist Richardson has earned a Level III Maternal designation from the Texas Department of Health Services. This recognition acknowledges the hospital's quality comprehensive care for both mothers and babies.

Methodist Richardson also successfully renewed its status as a Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, certifying that we are able to provide comprehensive care for seriously ill newborns. Parents can rest assured that their little ones are getting top-notch care.



SURGICAL TEAM ACHIEVES MAJOR MILESTONE

Methodist Richardson reached a major milestone in its robotic surgery program last year. The operating and surgical team has now performed more than 3,500 minimally invasive procedures using the da Vinci surgical robots.

The three robotic systems, including models S, Xi, and X, have helped patients during gallbladder, gastrointestinal, general, gynecologic, pancreatic, thoracic, and urological procedures.
