Committed to a healthy community

- Medical support for local athletes. Methodist Mansfield provided echocardiograms, sports physicals, health education, and team physicians for school athletes and supplied pedometers for every staff member in the Mansfield ISD.
- **Principals' Fitness Challenge.** This program promoted healthy lifestyles in the Mansfield ISD, creating fun ways for the principals, teachers, students, and parents to be more active, eat better, and get healthy.
- **City wellness programs.** Methodist Mansfield hosted educational programs and health screenings for local city employees.
- **Shattered Dreams.** To help promote teen awareness of drunk driving, Methodist Mansfield served as a site for the Shattered Dreams program for community school districts.

Heart care to count on

Methodist Mansfield Medical Center expanded its cardiac care offerings this year:

- Accredited Cycle III Chest Pain Center with PCI (percutaneous coronary intervention). This is the Society of Chest Pain Centers' highest level of achievement.
- Minimally invasive open heart surgery. With our cardiovascular intensive care unit and advanced operating rooms, we're poised to be the area's go-to source for open heart surgery and interventional cardiology.
- New heart procedures. In the hospital's cardiac catheterization lab, we're now performing atrial septal defect repair to correct heart defects, as well as a new catheterization procedure through the wrist, called TR PCI, which reduces the risk for complications.
