Intensive care reaches new heights

Critical care at Methodist Charlton Medical Center reached a whole new level in 2016 when the hospital opened a brand-new intensive care unit (ICU). The unit moved to the hospital's A Tower and grew by eight beds. More beds — 32 total — mean more space to provide the specialized care needed for the many critically ill patients admitted to the ICU each year.

The spacious new rooms are specifically designed for the care and comfort of patients and their families, with larger sitting areas and separate lighting for visitors.

Methodist Charlton's new ICU has special features that enhance patient safety and patient care. Specially designed workspaces promote coordination and communication among members of the critical care team. Enhanced technology supports patient monitoring, thereby increasing patient safety.

Certified critical care pulmonologists are in the ICU 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, providing high-level care for our sickest patients. According to medical studies, this round-the-clock attention



A heart for wellness: How we're reaching the community

Methodist Health System and Methodist Charlton Medical Center are improving the health of our community with these initiatives:

- Faith Community Nursing. Through local churches, Methodist provides education and health outreach, including flu shots and biometric screenings.
- Methodist Generations. This program offers wellness activities, social events, and educational outreach for people ages 55 and older.
- Mobile mammography. In collaboration with Susan G. Komen® Dallas County, Methodist's mobile

mammography unit brought breast cancer screening directly to 2,603 women in 2016, including 811 in the Methodist Charlton service area.

• Methodist Alliance for Patients and Physicians (MAP²). This accountable care organization (ACO) improves and saves lives through coordinated care for more than 55,000 people. These patients have seen overall improvement in health measures, as well as a lowered overall cost of care. For these efforts, MAP² has achieved national recognition for the quality of care given to patients.

In late 2016, Harbor Hospice leased space on the fifth floor of Methodist Charlton Medical Center's F Tower to dedicate to hospice care. The 14-bed unit at Methodist Charlton will provide those in the Best Southwest cities this specialized care at the end of a patient's life, working

with families to ensure their loved ones are cared for as they would hope.

An open house for the unit in October 2016 was attended by leaders from Harbor Hospice and Methodist Charlton. The unit began receiving patients in late January 2017.
