

CANCER PROGRAM OUTCOMES REPORT

2019 cancer registry report with statistical registry data from 2018

The Methodist Richardson Medical Center registry added 1,201 new analytic and nonanalytic cases to its database in 2018. This data includes 811 new analytic cases: 394 males and 417 females.

Analytic cases include:

- Patients whose cancers were diagnosed and initially treated at Methodist Richardson
- Patients whose cancers were diagnosed at Methodist Richardson and initially treated elsewhere
- Patients whose cancers were diagnosed elsewhere, but received all or part of their treatment at Methodist Richardson

Nonanalytic cases include:

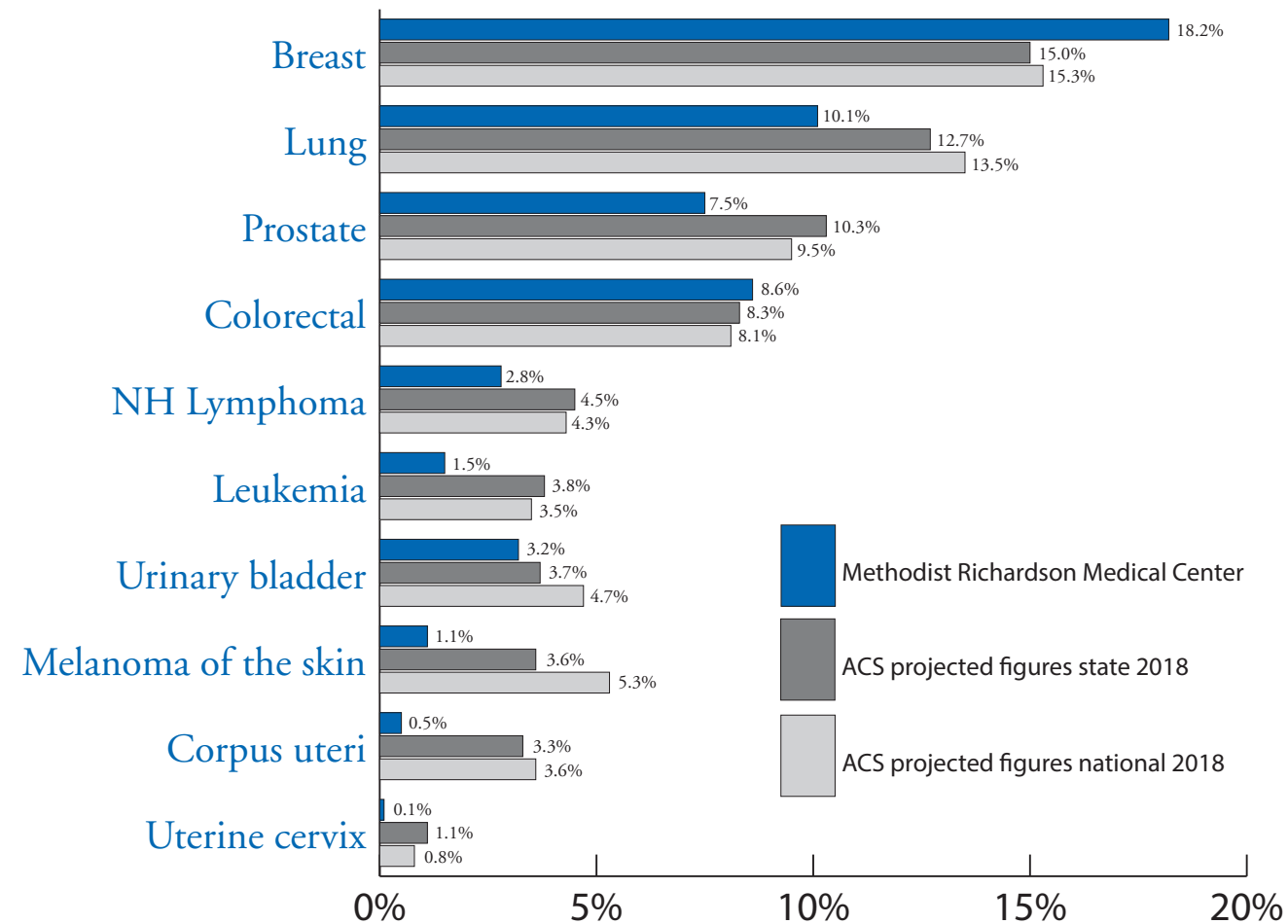
- Patients whose cancers were diagnosed and initially treated elsewhere and present to Methodist Richardson for disease recurrence or persistent.
- Patients whose cancers were diagnosed and initially treated elsewhere and have cancers that are active, recurrent, metastatic, or persistence, and presented for other medical conditions
- Approximately 3,358 nonanalytic cancer patients are followed in the registry.
- Follow-up is conducted annually and throughout the lifetime of each cancer patient.

In 2018, our top sites of newly diagnosed cancer cases (analytic only) were breast, bronchus and lung, colorectal, pancreas, prostate gland, kidney, stomach, liver, bladder, and non-Hodgkin lymphomas.

WHAT'S NEW AT METHODIST RICHARDSON?

The Women's Imaging Center at Methodist Richardson installed a 3D mammography unit with the Affirm® breast biopsy guidance system in June 2019. This upright 3D system offers a proven method for accurately targeting subtle lesions. The mammography units also use the SmartCurve™ breast stabilization system, which is a curved compression surface that enhances patient comfort while maintaining image quality.

The Women's Imaging Center is accredited by the American College of Radiology for 3D imaging and stereotactic biopsy.

We are excited to continue to offer 3D screening mammography to our patients, as well as the opportunity to assist them in their breast imaging needs. Our appointment schedule includes early morning and late evening weekday appointments, along with Saturday appointments for our patient's convenience.



How we provided screenings to find cancer in 2019

ABHOP mammography screening

The Asian Breast Health Outreach project (ABHOP) at Methodist Richardson responded to the needs of the Asian community by sponsoring 48 outreach events reaching 1,266 people. ABHOP provided 740 screening mammograms, 126 diagnostic exams, and 19 needle biopsies and found nine breast cancers. Methodist Richardson treated seven of the nine breast cancer patients.

Skin cancer screening

In May 2019, the Methodist Richardson Cancer Center held a skin cancer screening event open to the public. Of the 59 individuals screened, four cancers were found, three basal cell and one squamous cell. Patients were treated by the dermatology department. We are committed to annual community screenings, and each year the attendance increases.

Colon cancer screening

During the month of March 2019, Methodist Richardson Cancer Center partnered with the GI lab to provide information on the importance of colon screening by colonoscopy (the gold standard) and Cologuard®. Information was distributed to 200 employees. The GI lab provided a Saturday for employees to schedule colonoscopies and six took advantage of this opportunity.
